






Hospital Acquired Conditions

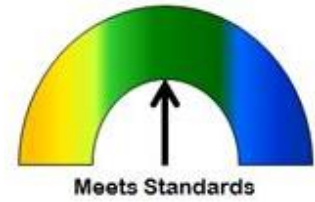
